## 1 – Definition

---

The WHR (World Horseball Ranking) is a recognition system based on the performance of a player, horse, coach, club and on the participation of a referee.

Starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2013 all FIHB competitions will be taken in account to establish the ranking lists of International players, horses, clubs, coaches, starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2014 also for referees and Nations, starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 the WHR system is opened to National Championships (clubs, players, coaches) and starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2020 the WHR system is opened also to U8, U10, U12 and U14 players.

The ranking lists are established by points gained by Horse-Ball players, horses, coaches, clubs or referees in participating to recognized FIHB event and registered National Championships: they will be automatically ranked in the World International Ranking List.

The period between two consecutive FIHB Seniors Champions League is called FIHB year. For a particular FIHB year, the points gained by each participant are counted starting from the first FIHB competitions or National Championship after the FIHB Seniors Champions League of the previous calendar year until the next FIHB Seniors Champions League (example FIHB year 2019: points are gathered from September 9<sup>th</sup> 2018 till October 6<sup>th</sup> 2019).

Those who want to be in the ranking lists for the FIHB current year or in the active n years (n=2...8) have to fulfil the following conditions:

- to be registered to the FIHB paying the fee defined in the par.5 “Inscription fees” or in the par.4.2 “National Championship – inscription fees”;
- to participate to an International event approved by FIHB or to a registered National Championship.

Points attributed depend on the type of International event or National Championship the players participate as specified in par.3 “Point System for International Competitions” or in par.4.1 “Point System for National Championship”; the type of International event is reported in par.2 “Classification of International Competitions” while the type of National Championship is reported in par.4.

The Ranking List started for:

- Players;
- Horses;
- Clubs;
- Coaches.

But from 2014 is opened also to:

- Referees;
- Nations.

From 2017 is opened also for National Championships and from 2020 is opened also to U8, U10, U12 and U14 players.

## 2 – Classification of International Competitions

Each International Competition is classified with the following ranking method based on number of stars as defined at par.26 in the FIHB Organization Rules.

- a World Cup is a 5\* competition;
- an European or Continental Cup (Americas or Asian Cup) is at least a 4\* competition;
- a Champions League is at least a 3\* competition.

### 3 – Point System for International Competitions

The Point System for International Competitions is described below for each category and for each type of competition.

#### 3.1 - International Competitions: Point System for Players, Horses, Clubs, Coaches and Nations

The Point System for Players, Horses, Clubs, Coaches and Nations are listed in the tables below for the competitions held from 2018 (from 2020 for 2 stars competitions).

For the multistage events (minimum 2 stages and 4 matches / team) held from 2020, the point system is upgraded to the next level, for example if the multistage event is a 2 stars event, the point system for 3 stars events has to be used.

#### **Notes for Point System for Players**

For the competitions held from 2013:

- extra 10 points for the team (so each player) winning the “Fair Play” award.

For the competitions held from 2015:

- the points gained by an Under16 player, participating to Under16 and Senior competitions in the same year, will be split in the relevant categories for the year ranking while will be summed together for the other type of rankings (history, 8 years);
- the points gained by the players in an Under21 competition are recorded as Senior category.

#### **Notes for Point System for Coaches**

- only one coach per registered team will gain the awarded points;
- the coach of two or more teams in the same competition will gain only the points related to the best team.

- extra points for the player winning “Top Scorer” award, also in ex aequo case.
- extra points for the player winning “Best Horse-Player Combination” award.
- extra points for the horse winning “Best Horse-Player Combination” award.
- extra points for the Club with the player winning “Best Horse-Player Combination” award in IE 1\*...5° and CLs.

For the competitions held from 2015:

- the points gained by an Under16 player, participating to Under16 and Senior competitions in the same year, will be split in the relevant categories for the year ranking while will be summed together for the other type of rankings (history, 8 years);
- the points gained by the players in an Under21 competition are recorded as Senior category.

### 3.4 - International Competitions: Point System for Players and Ponies for the U8...U14 categories

For the competition held from 2020:

For the U8...U14 competitions there is no assignment of WHR points for:

- Top Scorer;
- Best Horse-Player Combination;
- Fair Play Team.

The point system for coaches, clubs and nations is that one related to the number of stars of the competition.

#### 4 – WHR system for a National Championship

A National Championship could be included into WHR system if the following conditions are met:

- **Category:** Pro Elite, Ladies or Under16;
- **Level:** 1<sup>st</sup> league;
- **Number of teams:** 2 to 10;
- **Competition system:** to be submitted to the FIHB Bureau for approval.

#### 4.1 – Point System for National Championship

The Point System for National Championship foresees to assign ranking points to each player, top scorer, coach and club of each category.

If in a country there are 2 National Championships in a FIHB year (time between 2 Senior Champions League), for the calculation of the WHR points, the results of the 1st one will be counted in the current FIHB year and the results of the 2nd one will be postponed to the next FIHB year.

The Point System Players is shown below and it takes into account the number of teams participating in a National Championship.

#### 4.1.1 – National Championship: Point System Players, Coaches and Clubs

- only one coach per registered team will gain the awarded points unless the fact that during the season the coach is exchanged with a new one: in that case each coach, will gain the expected points divided by the number of coaches involved, two or more.

#### 4.1.2 – National Championship: Point System Players – Top Scorer

For the competitions held from 2018:

- extra 20 points for the player winning the “Top Scorer” award:

#### 4.2 – National Championship: inscription fees

Each National Federation or ONHB has to pay the annual fee for each category of the National Championship in order to be included into the WHR system. Those fees for 2020 are offered by FIHB.

#### 4.3 – Requirements for the inclusion of a National Championship

A National Federation or a ONHB that wants to include a National Championship into the WHR system has to be compliant with the following requirements:

- Send to FIHB the National calendar before the beginning of the National Championship(s);
- Send to FIHB the participants Clubs, the data of each player and coach (name, nationality, gender, birth date) and the top scorer information just after the end of the National Championship;
- Display the FIHB WHR banners on the pitch during all the competitions of the National Championship.

#### 4.4 – Format of the data to be transmitted to FIHB

The National Federation or ONHB has to transmit to FIHB the data related to the clubs, players, coaches of each category of National Championship they want to include into the WHR system. The responsibility for the correctness of the transmitted data is of the involved National Federation or ONHB.

The data should be contained in an excel file where the following columns describe the necessary data:

- Classification of the club: number (1...3-10);
- Club: text with first letter in upper case unless special cases with all upper cases (i.e.UCPA);
- Coach: text with first name and last name with first letter only in upper case;
- Coach's nationality: text with nation code in 3 letters in upper case;
- Player: with first name and last name with first letter only in upper case;
- Player's nationality: text with nation code in 3 letters in upper case;
- Player's gender: text as male or female;
- Player's birth date: date in the format dd/mm/yyyy;
- Top scorer: text as YES or NO.

## 5 – Inscription fees

---

Each member of a category has to pay the inscription fee at each competition in order to be included in the WHR. Those fees for 2020 are listed in the table below.

In case of missing payment of the WHR inscription fees within the end of the competition, the team or participant involved will be disqualified and the WHR points not granted.

## 6 – Ranking types

---

The following ranking lists are foreseen:

- **FIHB current year ranking list:** in this ranking list are listed all the participants that paid the FIHB inscription fee (see par.4) for their category (player, horse, coach, club, referee) and that participated to the FIHB competitions in that FIHB current year. The ranking list is a rolling list and it will be frozen at the end of each calendar year.
- **Active nY ranking list:** in this ranking list are listed all the participants that paid the FIHB inscription fee (see par.4) for their category (player, horse, coach, club, referee) and that participated to the FIHB competitions in the last n years (n=2...8).
- **History ranking list:** in this ranking list are listed all the participants to the FIHB competitions since 1992.

Different types of ranking lists are foreseen for the different categories. Those ranking lists are below described.

### 6.1 - WHR ranking lists for Players

For the Players there are three WHR ranking lists:

1. WHR - History Players Ranking: all the players participating to FIHB competitions from 1992 are listed;
2. WHR - Active 8Y Players Ranking: all the players that paid the inscription fee and that participated to FIHB competitions in the last 8 years are listed;
3. WHR - FIHB current year Players Ranking: all the players that paid the inscription fee and that participated to FIHB competitions in the FIHB current year are listed.

### 6.2 - WHR ranking list for Horses

For the Horses there are two WHR ranking lists:

1. WHR – Active 8Y Horses Ranking: all the horses for which the inscription fee has been paid and that participated to FIHB competitions in the last 8 years are listed;
2. WHR – FIHB current year Horses Ranking: all the horses for which the inscription fee has been paid and that participated to FIHB competitions in the FIHB current year are listed.

### **6.3 - WHR ranking lists for Clubs**

For the Clubs there are two WHR ranking lists:

1. WHR - History Clubs Ranking: all the clubs participating to FIHB competitions from 2007 are listed;
2. WHR - FIHB current year Clubs Ranking: all the clubs for which the inscription fee has been paid and that participated to FIHB competitions in the FIHB current year are listed.

### **6.4 - WHR ranking lists for Coaches**

For the Coaches there are three WHR ranking lists:

1. WHR - History Coaches Ranking: all the coaches participating to FIHB competitions from 1992 are listed;
2. WHR - Active 8Y Coaches Ranking: all the coaches that paid the inscription fee and that participated to FIHB competitions in the last 8 years are listed;
3. WHR – FIHB current year Coaches Ranking: all the coaches for which the inscription fee has been paid and that participated to FIHB competitions in the FIHB current year are listed.

### **6.5 - WHR ranking list for Referees (from 2014)**

For the Referees there are two WHR ranking lists:

1. WHR – Active 7Y Referees Ranking: all the Referees that paid the inscription fee and that participated to FIHB competitions in the last 7 years are listed;
2. WHR – FIHB current year Referees Ranking: all the Referees for which the inscription fee has been paid and that participated to FIHB competitions in the FIHB current year are listed.

### **6.6 - WHR ranking list for Nations (from 2014)**

For the Nations there is one WHR ranking list:

1. WHR - History Nations Ranking: all the Nations participating to FIHB competitions from 1992 are listed.

## **7 – Awards**

---

Each year after the FIHB Seniors Champions League, all the ranking lists will be frozen and the three best total point of each ranking will be awarded. Their names will be published on the FIHB web site at the section “Hall of Fame” for the relevant year.

## **8 – Votes for the best horse-player combination and fair play team**

---

The votes for the best horse-player combination and fair play team shall be sent via WhatsApp or SMS to a defined FIHB responsible within the end of the competition. The defined FIHB responsible will receive, check and count all the votes and then will inform the OC responsible on time for the relevant prize giving.

## **9 – FIHB Horseball Masters**

---

Each year at the end of the season, a maximum of 24 players (top 12 Ladies, top 12 Pro Elite) in the FIHB WHR ranking will be invited to participate to the FIHB Horseball Masters event. It will be taken into account the players that were active in the last 12 months prior the FIHB Horse Master and their position in the FIHB WHR ranking of the last 4 years plus the points gained in the FIHB current year, 1 months prior the event. The nation that will host that event has the right to present a maximum of 6 players (top 3 Ladies, top 3 Pro Elite) while the other maximum 18 will be chosen among the other nation.

## 10 – Example of ranking list

An example of ranking list is shown below and the relevant notes are:

1. type of ranking list;
2. update level;
3. position in the ranking list;
4. current status of the member indicating the payment for the fee in the FIHB current year;
5. total point of the member;
6. year, place and name of the competition;
7. point assigned to each member for each competition.
